


# tips for a cooler home



# It's going to be HOT this summer

Here are 7 tips to make your home cooler and save on your energy bills. Some tips are easy and low-cost. Other are more expensive and will be a long-term investment.

 $\checkmark$  Stick these tips on your fridge at home to refer back to.



### Create a cool room

#### Focus on keeping 1 room cool to save money

- Find the coolest room in your home
- Close windows and doors to other rooms
- If your home is open plan, block off unused areas with curtains, or blankets
- Use fans and air-conditioning to cool the room
- Set your air-conditioner to 26 to reduce energy use
- Turn your air-conditioner on early. It will need to work harder if the house is already hot.



### Seal any gaps

### Stop hot air getting in your home through gaps

- Check for gaps around windows, doors and between floorboards
- Use draught stoppers to seal gaps. You can make draught stoppers at home using old socks and stockings, or simply roll up a towel or bedding.



### Get to know your neighbours

It's important to be able to get help or help others during a heat wave.

- Make sure you know someone close by you can call on for help, or who you can help.
- Swap phone numbers to call in case of an emergency.



### Water your garden

# Trees and plants provide shade and help cool the air around your home.

- Watering your garden before the heatwave is best
- Water in the early morning or evening
- $\neg$  Mulch around plants to prevent the soil drying out
- Be mindful of water restrictions.



### Use the microwave

# Your microwave uses less energy to cook, defrost and re-heat than a standard oven.

• Microwaves direct most of their energy into the food, rather than the kitchen. That means you'll stay more comfortable and use less energy whilst removing cooking heat from your home.



### **Cover your windows**

#### Protect windows from sun inside and out.

- Outside: Install shade cloth or place plants to block the sun
- Inside: Choose thick curtains in pale colours to help reflect heat
- Avoid dark colours and metal venetian blinds as they absorb heat.

### **Reduce power costs**

If you're worried about the cost of using your air conditioner during heatwaves, solar can help.

• There are many Government incentives to improve the energy efficiency of your home.

• Talk to your landlord. If you rent your home and need bigger changes to ensure it stays cool in summer talk to your landlord about the State Government rebates.
