Making a submission to a **Planning Permit Application**

What can I do if I am notified of a Planning Application?

Learn about the application

If you are notified of a planning application, the first step is to review the advertised application material (plans and other information) on our website at www.merribek.vic.gov.au/advertplans or by scanning the QR code below.

You can also call Council on 9240 1111 and speak to a Planner or book a 10-minute face-to-face meeting by visiting our online booking page, if you would like more information or help understanding what's proposed.

Council's assessment of an application depends on why the proposal needs a Planning Permit in the first place. Council officers can help provide technical advice on the relevant parts of the Planning Scheme.

Decide whether to lodge a submission

After you have viewed the application material, you have two options:

Unconcerned?

If you are unconcerned by the proposal, you don't have to take any further action.

Concerned?

After a discussion with a Planner. if you have a concern about the proposal, you may object to it on Councils website.

How do I lodge a submission?

You can make a submission at www.merri-bek.vic.gov.au/advertplans

Submissions should be lodged within the 14-day notice period, however all submissions made prior to a decision has been made will be considered. Council will not decide on an application before the notice period ends.

Ensure your submission is effective

Tips for your submission:

- ✓ Clearly explain how the proposal may impact you. If only part of the proposal will impact you, highlight this. The use of dot points to describe how each issue affects you, can work well.
- ✓ Provide evidence for your concerns where possible. Supporting images can be helpful.
- \checkmark If possible, relate your concerns back to relevant parts of the Planning Scheme.
- ✓ Include suggestions of solutions that might address your concerns.

Common concerns generally not considered valid grounds for objection:



- Loss of property value
- Impacts on views
- Commercial competition
- · Who will live in the development
- Increased vehicle pollution
- Asbestos removal
- Boundary fencing between private properties (covered by the Fences Act)
- Construction process impact (addressed at building permit stage)

Note – Contact Council should you have concerns on the above grounds

Common objection concerns open for discussion:



- Impact on the character of the neighbourhood and heritage controls
- Overlooking (e.g. balconies/windows that can look into a backyard)
- Overshadowing (casting shadows over backyards)
- Insufficient car parking (only if seeking a reduction)
- Noise related to the proposed use
- Removal of significant trees and tree impacts
- Building scale and visual bulk.

What happens next?

Once you make a submission, you will receive an acknowledgement letter from Council.

This letter includes an overview of what happens after you lodge your submission. The next steps usually include:

- \checkmark Communication from the planning officer to discuss concerns
- \checkmark Council consideration of submissions received when making a decision
- ✓ Receiving a copy of Council's Notice of Decision or Refusal to Grant a Planning Permit.

Petitions, or joint objections from the same address count as one submission. Council will send all correspondence to the first name listed on the petition.
