To whom it may concern,

I wish to lodge an objection to the council's proposed changes to its public open space contribution amendment.

We are presently in the midst of a housing crisis and a cost of living crisis, where one of the major identified issues is the cost of developing, along with delays in approvals.

Presently the open space contribution regime for Merri-bek requires between 3.1% and 6.8%, to suggest this will rise by around 4-7%, sometimes more than a doubling in some cases is ludicrous and will add yet another impost on a development industry that is already effectively stalled on account of the cost of compliance and construction.

I've read the officer report. It provides some background as to why this change is being proposed. In my interpretation, it is based on the costs of council providing services and that a considerable amount of time has passed since it was last changed.

There was no thought or discussion on how this proposal might be received by the people who are required to pay it!

Before you proceed, it is essential to gain an understanding (independent from council) that provides analysis on how the change will be received in the marketplace.

Until a robust independent analysis is carried out and it is concluded that the impact on the provision of housing is within acceptable limits, the amendment should not proceed.

Thought should also be given in this assessment of the role of application fees, MPL fees and also the provision of services that would benefit those who pay the fees.

Additionally, as the costs of delay in council processing is now a major consideration in the economics of development some thought ought to be given to genuine 'fasty tracking' particularly in locations where the contribution is proposed to be at the higher end.

Planning Scheme Amendment C235mbek

The amendment proposes to update the public open space contribution rate in the Schedule to Clause 53.01, to collect development contributions to support the implementation of the Open Space Strategy (OSS).

Specifically, the amendment proposes to:

- Amend the Schedule to Clause 53.01 (Public Open Space Contribution and Subdivision) to require subdivisions to provide a public open space contribution at a rate of 8.68% for all areas.
- Amend the Schedule to Clause 72.08 (Background documents) by including the following background documents:
 - Merri-bek Public Open Space Contributions Refresh, Open Space Contributions Schedule (HillPDA, 2025).
 - o Merri-bek Open Space Apportionment Methodology (Mesh, 2025).

Current public open space contribution

The current public open space contribution rate for each area varies from 2.5% (Brunswick West) to 6.8% (Coburg). The current public open space contribution rate for the subject site is as follows:

Proposed public open space contribution

The exhibited public open space rate is as follows:

Submission

In respect to the exhibited Amendment, please note the following:

- The proposed rate will have an unreasonable impact on the economic vitality of future / proposed developments.
- The Amendment material does not provide for adequate justification to support a 8.68% public open space rate across all areas.

- The proposed rate of 8.68% is excessive, especially for a large infill/opportunity site such as the subject site.
- It is submitted that any new provisions introduced via C235mbek should include transitional provisions.
