The Preschool Field Officer Program

The program provides practical support and advice to State-funded kindergarten programs in long day care centres and sessional kindergartens, supporting the inclusion of children with additional needs.

Preschool Field Officer work within the context of the early childhood program, acting as a consultant to the early childhood teacher and educators.

The program is provided by Merri-bek City Council and funded by the Victorian Department of Education and Training at no cost to families or kindergartens.



Preschool Field Officer Key Roles

- Observing children with diverse needs and providing specialised and practical advice.
- Consultancy support to kindergarten staff with planning, implementation and review of developmentally appropriate programs for all children.
- Supporting and building capacity
 of early childhood teachers and
 educators with strategies and
 resources to ensure inclusive
 practices, such as providing
 specialised information on children's
 specific additional needs and
 identifying appropriate training.
- Supporting referrals and linkages to specialist services for children and their families.
- Assisting the application process for additional funding (Kindergarten Inclusion Support Program) if required.
- Providing an independent opinion as required when considering a second year of funded
 Four-Year-Old Kindergarten.

The program assists children:

- Of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander origin.
- With a disability or developmental delay – including children with mild language delays, diverse needs and children with multiple disabilities.
- With additional needs from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.
- Who have experienced trauma.
- Who have diverse learning needs.
- Who are experiencing social and/or emotional difficulties at kindergarten.

The referral can be made by:

- Parent/Guardian.
- Kindergarten teacher.
- Paediatrician.
- Allied Health (Speech, Occupational Therapy).
- Maternal and Child Health Nurse.
- Inclusion Professional.
- Family Support agencies.

The Preschool Field Officer Program referral form is completed jointly by the professional and the parent/guardian and signed by both parties (where applicable).

Early Start Kindergarten (ESK)

Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) provides up to 15 hours of **FREE** kindergarten each week to eligible children.

Is my child eligible for ESK?

Your child is eligible if they are are at least three years old by 30 April in the year they are enrolled to attend the kindergarten program and are:

- from a refugee or asylum seeker background, or
- identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, or
- family has had contact with child protection.
