

Bring a magnifying glass if you can.


#### BIRD Watcher

TREE Hugger


Can you find trees with different bark?

Some are smooth and some are rough.



Find somewhere you can get up high - the top of a hill, or standing on a rock.

Yell "Cooee" to your friends.



#### SHADOW Play

On a sunny day, try to make your shadow into plant or animal shapes.



#### LOOK FOR Leaves

Look on the ground for different types of leaves.

There are lots of different shapes and colours - how many can you find?

Crush them in your hands and see what they smell like.



## NIGHT TIME

Look up at the sky one night to find the stars and the moon.

You can do this from your backyard, balcony or out your window.



#### FIND A ROCK or log to balance on

How long can you balance for?

Or try balancing a stone on your nose.



#### LOOK FOR A PUDDLE On a rainy Day and Jump in it!

Follow the trail to see where it goes.
