# Vehicle Crossing in Asphalt for Sawn A170.11 Bluestone Kerb and Channel



#### **GENERAL NOTES**

- 1. A Vehicle Crossing Permit is required.
- Asphalt vehicular crossing is only to be used in street having full width asphalt footpath and sawn bluestone kerb.
- 3. Splay S = 1.00m for residential, =1.50m for commercial/industrial.
- All joints to existing asphalt to be sawcut, cleaned and tack-coated.
- Council's inspection officer to have discretion to vary standard, depending on existing street conditions including crossing shape and the treatment of the street channel.
- 6. Kerb transition to be 0.5m.
- Refer to AS 2890.1 to ensure vehicles are not scraping.
- 8. Refer to Road Pavement Reinstatement in Front of New Vehicle Crossing SD 265E.

#### **DESIGN STATEMENT**

Asphalt crossing is an economical alternative vehicular crossing for various established areas within Merri-bek. The bluestone kerb and channel for vehicle crossing is designed to create a smooth and continuous edging and surface drainage, yet provide a traditional material interface between the driveway and the road pavement.

To be applied to streets as specified in Coburg Streetscape Masterplan and Brunswick Public Realm Design Manual.
