A minute with our new Mayor

Name: Lambros Tapinos.

History on Moreland Council: Third term as Mayor, was elected to Council in November 2008.

How long have you lived in Moreland? I have lived in Brunswick my whole life. I wouldn't live anywhere else, it's a great city.

What do you like doing on weekends? I like going to the football to watch Carlton play. I like having a kick of the soccer ball at Clifton Park and spending time with family and friends.

Where is your favourite place in Moreland? Sydney Road, especially the restaurants and food shops where you can get traditional food from around the world.

Why did you become a councillor? I became a councillor because I wanted to contribute to my local community, particularly around creating open spaces, improving sporting facilities, creating community hubs and providing essential services to young families and seniors.

What do you want to achieve as Mayor of Moreland? As Mayor of Moreland, I want to create more open space for our community to enjoy and I am looking forward to opening two new parks in Brunswick in 2020. I want to develop our community hub at Saxon Street in Brunswick to create a vibrant community space where our local artists and community groups can come together and thrive.

Changes to parking in Moreland

Moreland is facing the challenge of strong population growth. By 2036 we will be home to 50,000 more people.

If there is no change of today's rates of car ownership, this will mean an extra 32,000 cars, impacting the liveability of our city. We would need the equivalent of 34 Melbourne Cricket Grounds (MCGs) worth of space to keep them.

We are acting now to slow the number of cars in our city. We are encouraging those who are able, to consider options like walking, cycling and public transport. To help encourage this shift, Council is changing parking time limits in selected streets within some areas. In these areas, on street parking which does not currently have a time limit is changing to 2P 8am to 11pm Monday to Friday (in most cases).

Every resident and business affected by the changes will receive a letter and a reminder. These letters provide information about the permit options available to residents and visitors.

We understand that this change is difficult for some people. We've listened and made changes to our parking policy to address concerns about those most vulnerable in our community.

There will be more changes to parking in selected areas in early 2020.

New pool safety regulations – saving kids' lives



On 1 December 2019, the State Government introduced new laws to improve swimming pool and spa safety.

These laws mean all land owners must register their pool or spa with their local Council and pay a one-off registration and pool-construction-date search fee.

Property owners – including landlords – will need to register their swimming pool or spa with Council by 1 June 2020.

Once owners have registered their swimming pool or spa we will send through an inspection date. This means your pool or spa safety barriers must be inspected and issued with a safety certificate by this date.

Inspection and safety certificate services can be provided by Council's Building Services Unit or through private building inspectors or surveyors.

A one-off registration fee – of \$31.84 and a pool construction date search fee of \$47.24 (both set by the State Government) – need to be paid upon registration. The new State Government laws also mean you'll have to get re-certification of your private swimming pool or spa barriers every four years.

This is to prevent the high number of children drowning in pools and spas where barriers and fences have deteriorated over time.

Pools can be registered online at moreland.vic.gov.au/pool-safety. **Again, all pools must be registered by 1 June 2020.**

Drowning in private swimming pools is the greatest cause of accidental death for children under five in Australia. This new system aims to combat this.

Avoid fines by registering your pool or spa by 1 June 2020, and for getting a safety certificate by the date issued. This will depend on when your pool or spa was built.

Food and garden organics collection

Our food and garden organics collection service (formerly green waste service) now accepts food waste.

If you already have an organics (green waste) bin can now place food scraps in this bin along with your garden waste.

Top tips for using your organics bin:

- Store your bin in the shade and keep the lid closed tightly when not in use
- Empty your kitchen caddy or container regularly and wash at least once a week

- Put dry garden waste in the bottom of your organics bin to stop food waste sticking to the bottom
- Clean up spillages on the outside of your bin to avoid attracting flies or other pests

Keeping cool and safe in the heat



With heatwaves becoming a regular feature of the Victorian summer, it's important to look after yourself and others when extreme heat hits.

There are simple things you can do to stay safe in the heat:

• Drink plenty of water (always take a reusable bottle with you)

- Hot cars kill never leave kids, adults or pets in hot cars. The temperature inside a parked car can double within minutes.
- Keep cool seek out air-conditioned buildings, draw your blinds, use a fan, take cool showers and dress in light and loose clothing made from natural fabrics.

- Help others look out for older people, younger people, and those with medical conditions.
- Don't forget your pets and leave shallow dishes of water out for wildlife

AROUND THE WARDS IN SUMMER

North-East Ward

Coburg | Coburg North | Fawkner

Coburg City Oval pavilion works will start early this year and finish in 2021. The \$6.7 million project will include new change rooms, a refurbished grandstand, gym and social event spaces to improve accessibility for Moreland's growing female and junior sporting teams.

Richards Reserve Sports Pavilion,

Coburg North, works will start early this year, with an \$850,000 investment by Council to improve facilities for local sports clubs that use the Velodrome and soccer pitch. Refurbishments include change rooms, storage and social space. Works will be completed mid-2020.



The Merlynston Maternal and Child Health centre will begin refurbishment works in early 2020 and is expected to be finished mid-year. The refurbishment and additional space will allow for increased services to meet the increase in population and demand for information in areas of parenting, child health and development for all families and children. And pedestrian-friendly spaces for everyone to enjoy.

Glenroy | Gowanbrae | Hadfield | Oak Park | Pascoe Vale | Pascoe Vale

Works are underway for femalefriendly changerooms as part of \$331,800 Reddish Reserve upgrades. These will include accessible female-friendly umpire and player changerooms for Pascoe Vale FC and Moreland Zebras FC.

Construction on public shade structures at Morgan Court, Glenroy, will start in March or April this year. The works will improve public space by installing 2 sculptural shade structures and making minor changes to provide a more usable space for events.



Building of the Wheatsheaf
Community Hub will start this year.
The \$26.4 million hub will become
the new home of the Glenroy Library,
the Glenroy Memorial Kindergarten
and will include maternal child
health, a community health provider,
neighbourhood learning and childcare
services. The adjacent Bridget Shortell
Reserve will also be developed with
fresh open green spaces, improved
play and active recreation spaces and
new public amenities.

The redevelopment of Fleming Park, Brunswick East, is underway. Works include a repurposing of the grandstand, new public amenities and upgrades to existing facilities including the community hall and Bocce Club building. There will also be improvements to the bike path and children's play area, a reinstated car park and more.

consultation in January 2020. The
project will revitalise the area and

walkability, landscape and presentation

New parks at Tinning Street and West Street will start construction in early 2020 as part of Council's Park Close to Home program. Demolition has commenced on site and the parks are expected to be completed by mid to late-year. The two new parks will be named by community vote.
