To our wonderful residents,

I am deeply honoured to have been elected as the new Mayor of Merri-bek, a city defined by its diverse, engaged, and caring community. I am proud to lead Council over the next 12 months, alongside my dedicated fellow Councillors. Together, we look forward to serving you with integrity, keeping your best interests at the heart of everything we do.

Over the past year, Council has made significant progress. We've delivered on major developments, including the \$36 million Fawkner Leisure Centre, the \$29 million cultural and community hub in Brunswick – which will open over summer – and the new A Park Close to Home, Yubup Park, at 14 Frith Street. We've also continued providing over 150 services to our community, including maternal and child health, libraries, and in-home aged care. We've supported the construction of better-quality developments and taken local action on climate change by reducing emissions, supporting households to transition to renewable energy, and rolling out our purple glass bin to boost recycling.

As we enter Year 4 of our Council Plan, we remain focused on building a more sustainable, inclusive, and vibrant Merri-bek. We're committed to creating an environmentally proactive city, investing in sustainable transport options, and expanding open spaces. We will continue to advocate for better public transport and improve our networks to ensure safer, more equitable access across Merribek. We also remain dedicated to supporting our community's health and wellbeing, fostering inclusion for older people, those with disabilities, and the LGBTIQA+ community. We will continue supporting moves towards a Treaty with First Peoples and backing community calls for the Ballerrt Mooroop site in Glenroy to be returned to Traditional Custodians.

Our efforts to create vibrant public spaces will see the renewal of shopping strips, support for local festivals including the Glenroy Festival and Brunswick Music Festival, and the completion of the cultural and community hub in Brunswick. At the same time, we continue to work toward reducing our carbon footprint and achieving zero carbon emissions by 2040.

I am excited to embark on this journey with my fellow Councillors, Council staff, and the community. Thank you and here's to a great 2025!

## Small change, big impact

Pat yourself on the back, Merri-bek. In the first year of our 4-bin service, we've saved an extra 2,151 tonnes of household waste from landfill. That's the weight of 531 elephants that's been turned into compost or recycled into new products! It takes us one step closer to our goal of zero waste by 2030.

Since starting the service in July 2023, we've collected 2,462 tonnes of your glass bottles and jars to recycle right here in Victoria. We've seen an increase in food waste being turned into compost, instead of going to landfill. Twenty percent of the food and garden organics bin is now food waste, up from 5% in 2021.

Our 4-bin service introduced the new glass recycling bin, food and garden organics bins (which are collected weekly for all households) and the yellow mixed recycling bins (which are collected fortnightly). These changes are part of the Victorian Government's plan to standardise household recycling across the state and divert waste from landfill.

## Your ideas, your budget

Did you know there's a special section of our annual budget process reserved for you to suggest what you'd like to see in Merri-bek? It's called Community Budget Ideas. Now in its fourth consecutive year, the program has delivered a variety of community assets including sunshades over playgrounds, public seating, drinking fountains, half-court basketball rings and water refill stations.

We want to fund your ideas for projects that demonstrate a strong community benefit through our 2025-26 Council budget process. A proposed total of \$250,000 is available (subject to Council budget adoption).

Council encourages all Merri-bek residents, community groups and organisations to contribute their ideas. Ideas that meet funding criteria will be opened to community voting in February, and then considered by Council for decision as part of the budget process.

#### Yubup Park, 14 Frith Street

Our newest park is now open! Following input from the community, the park has officially been named Yubup Park – meaning Parakeet in Woiwurrung. Yubup Park was created through our A Park Close to Home program. It has a multi-court designed for various ball games, a ping-pong table, a bespoke bouldering wall, a sheltered BBQ and picnic table area, with plenty of open space including trees for shade as well as a sun lawn space for sitting and relaxing.



#### Fisher Reserve. Brunswick East

We're thrilled to announce that after taking on your feedback, Fisher Reserve has undertaken extensive upgrades and is ready for you to explore. The upgraded park features play spaces for younger children, a new nature-based play area with a log enclosure, sculptures, and a stepping-stone trail. There are new seating and picnic areas, additional trees and garden beds, a table tennis table as well as a drinking fountain, with access paths and safety features including new fencing and pedestrian gates. Look out for the newly installed insect hotels, supporting the natural ecosystem.



#### Hosken Reserve, Coburg North

Over the past two years, Council has worked hard to bring the Hosken Reserve Masterplan to life. The renewed spaces for play, connection and exercise are now open for the whole community to enjoy. Upgrades include a new active recreation area with play and exercise equipment for all ages, a community shelter and tennis pavilion along with two refurbished courts, two new soccer pitches (the north shared with Pascoe Vale Soccer Club available from February 2025), ample car parking and extensive landscaping, including 242 new trees!




#### Carlisle Street, Coburg

Upgrades along Carlisle St, Coburg, between Nicholson Street and Darlington Parade, are now complete following a community tree planting event. Approximately 400 plants were planted on the day, with the community coming together to share a cuppa and chat about the benefits of the completed works. The addition of new garden beds allowed 24 new trees to be planted for shade, as well as 1,000 understory plants. New asphalt and the addition of bluestone edging and solar lights also makes for a safer walking and riding experience.



## Shore Reserve public toilet, Pascoe Vale South

The renewed public toilet at Shore Reserve is now open. Located in the north-east corner of the reserve near the intersection of Melville Road and Reynard Street, the toilet is a single, unisex and accessible Exeloo and is open during daylight hours. Bicycle parking hoops have also been installed next to the toilet for riders using the facility.



## Road reconstruction and drainage upgrades, Beccles Street, Fawkner

We're pleased to announce the successful completion of the road reconstruction and drainage upgrade works at Beccles Street, Fawkner. The upgrade included the connection of all house drains into newly installed underground drainage, the replacement of kerbing and channelling, the installation of stormwater pits, laying of new asphalt and the installation of new and compliant bus shelters.
